Primary School Sports Funding 2015-16

At Moreland Primary School, we recognise the contribution of PE and sport to the health and well-being of the children. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children. We do 2 hours PE each week which includes a fitness challenge- the fitness challenge is changed termly: this term's challenge is to run or walk a mile at least 2 times.

Our Primary School Sport's Funding enables us to continue to extend our provision through employing additional sports professionals, entering into more sports competitions and training our staff to deliver in-house quality PE lessons.

What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing schools with funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years 2013/14 and 2014/15 to provide new and substantial primary school sport. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. The aim is to improve the quality of sport and PE for all children. Each school will receive £8,000 plus an extra £5 per pupil each year for the next two years - here at Moreland that meant £8,918 in 2013/14, £8,537 for 2014/15 and £9,000 for 2015/16. The money can only be spent on sport and PE provision and is part of the 2012 Olympic legacy which had such a massive impact upon our lives in this country. We have seen a massive improvement in the teaching of PE since this initiative began in 2013 because we have had the funding to employ specialists who work closely with our teachers' week on week. The children have enjoyed and benefitted from a range of sports which will continue post 2015 because we are 100% committed to providing the best sports opportunities that we can year on year.

Purpose of the funding:

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but we have the freedom to choose how we do this.

Possible uses of the funding include:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- New or additional sport clubs
- Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- Running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- Buying quality assured professional development modules or material for PE/sport
- Providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and residential visits

We spend more than our allocated grant for sports provision in Moreland School. In addition to the above the school provides swimming training for KS2 pupils. We have a fitness challenge each half term which constantly changes. This ranges from timed skipping to jogging. The impact of sports funding contributes to raising the profile of Moreland School in the local EC1 community. We are able to create memorable family occasions which create a great pride in our school. The sports funding has enabled us to employ specialists who guarantee the quality of the teaching of sport that will leave a legacy should the funding cease. Most of all the children love sport, they willingly participate in sport and they are very aware of fitness, health and team spirit.
